Principal's Ponderings...

Kia ora koutou (greetings to you all),

I hope this newsletter finds you in good spirits and in good health. There are a few things I would like to share with you this week:

Staff Leaving: At the end of this term we will be saying, "good-bye" to Miss Ashleigh Probert (fondly known as Miss P by the pupils). Miss Probert has been one of the longest serving staff at Hillview having worked for over 17 years. Most of her teaching at Hillview has been in the Year 3/4 area of the school. Miss Probert is part owner of a Kip McGrath franchise and will be heavily involved in tutoring and managing the business. It will be very sad to farewell Miss P but we are excited for the new season of life that awaits her.

In the same breath we warmly welcome Mrs Sacha Robinson. Mrs Robinson is a 3rd year teacher at Clearview Primary School in Rolleston. She started her teaching career at Otakiri School in 2013 as a Year 6/7 teacher and shifted to Christchurch at the end of the year (as her husband Dylan had a job transfer). She secured a job at Clearview Primary School for 2014 and worked at Year 3/4 then transitioned to Year 5/6 for this year. Sacha and her husband attend Lincoln Baptist. I am sure that you, along with me, will welcome her to our school community.

We are also welcoming Mrs Rosemary Fisher to our Y0-2 Learning Team as she will be the Y0/1 teacher for Term 3-4. Mrs Fisher worked here two years ago as a Year 1 teacher and arrives with a wealth of experience and expertise. She will begin teaching Room 8's current class at the beginning of next term while Mrs Harland begins teaching a new group of New Entrant children. Please pray that both teachers transition well into our community.

NB: As a school community we celebrate the arrival of Olivia Angela Nelson. Mr and Mrs Nelson are thrilled and both Mum and baby are doing very well. Dad is coping! She was born on Tuesday morning and weighed in at 4.4kg.

School Closure: I thought it would be worthwhile to remind the school community as to what our procedure of communication is when there may be a possibility of our school closing due to adverse conditions such as severe weather, natural disasters, and so forth:

A decision will be made by 7.30am and if you are unsure on whether the school is open, PLEASE follow these options;

a) check our website for a current message, b) ring the school and choose the cancellation's option to listen to our message or c) check to see if you have received a text from the school – this is for those who have signed up for the school text service. (If you haven't signed up, text HILLVIEW to 570. You will receive an instant confirmation text). **If there is no message by 7.40am on the website, cancellation answer phone service or school text service to indicate that the school is closed, you can safely assume that Hillview will be officially open.** NB: We will try and inform Newstalk ZB if the school does close and hope they will publicly announce this soon after 7.30am. Please help the school and protect the sanity of the office ladies by refraining from ringing the school and asking them if Hillview is open. I would like to re-assure you that there is much thought invested into making a decision around whether our school closes or remains open and it is a decision not taken lightly. If you genuinely think it is unsafe to bring your child to school, you are most welcome to keep them at home. If you do choose to do this, please ensure that you leave a message on the school absentee line. We would also ask respectfully for you not to instruct your child to carry around

their cell phone with them at school. If you *urgently* need to get hold of your child, contact the school office and the message will be relayed to the appropriate person as soon as possible.

Reports: Y0-8 School reports will be completed and sent home next week. Y0-8 reports will be based around the National Standards of Reading, Writing, and Mathematics. There will also be a section that reflects the appropriate key competencies. These reports clearly communicate the progress of your child. Please feel free to email your child's teacher if you have any further questions or make an appointment to see them in person during the option interviews to be held later in the year.

Gym Update: Hopefully you will have noticed that our new school gym is a hive of activity with several contractors visiting the site on a daily basis over the last 2-3 weeks. They are working their way through this wonderful community centre and significant progress has been made. We are still unsure of the completion date but you can rest assured that everything is being done to get it finished as soon as possible. I went for a visit this week and gave thanks to God that we, along with the community, will be able to use this amazing resource to bless our pupils and the surrounding community.

Tips for Learning

Year 3-6 Tips for Sports #2 (by Paul Norton)



Long distance running preparation

– The FITT Principal:

As with all the age groups, the goal for all children is to be able to complete the distance running/walking the whole way. For Year 3-6 children they can adhere to the **FITT** principles in their training in order to achieve excellence – **DOING THEIR BEST!**

F- Frequency – one fitness session a week is ok but two to three or more will see improvement. Do rest between sessions though.

I- Intensity – a slow jog/walk is ok but you will not really see any improvement. A good principle is to have a slow/long day and a short/fast day where the intensity is harder. Approximately a 60-80% effort will see improvements happen.

T – Time – not distance. The session may be six minutes of running, not 1km. Try to set a goal of say six minutes running rather than 1km.

T – Type – vary your training. Running the same course is boring. Try the steps behind St. Martins School or by Rapaki track. Go for a bike/run or find a little course along the river in Hansen Park. Do a Zumba or aerobics session.

Once a week it is good to try the course out – but maybe start with one lap, then try two and then three then try running them faster next time.
