#### Year 7-10 students still need you!

As students move into the senior school, they are often required to complete assignments at home. Many students are so relieved to simply complete a writing task that they hand it in without bothering to edit their work. Punctuation, sentence structure and vocabulary choices are often overlooked, and many assignments are presented like an unfinished painting. The sketch is there, but often there is little attention to detail.

#### How can you help?

Stay involved by keeping your young person accountable, not only for having the work done, but also ensuring that the quality of the work is their best. You might like to try setting aside some time each week where you can touch base and see how they are going. Try and keep the time positive.
