

### Principal's Ponderings...



Last week the school mourned the loss of two very special people - Shayden Gibbons-Kingdom and Niki Hibbert. Both exhibited a strong faith and impacted many people by the way they viewed life and lived it.

On Tuesday we celebrated Shayden's life (an ex-pupil who attended Hillview from 2003 - 2013). Shayden had muscular dystrophy which prevented him from walking at an early age and eventually assigned him to a wheel chair for the rest of his life. However, Shayden refused to let his condition hinder him from learning or from attending school events. I remember him making the effort to travel a considerable distance up to Windy Point to spend a day with his peers at Y10 camp. He was determined not to miss out but be part of the action. I will also remember him speaking courageously at an assembly about his journey in life and challenging pupils to be thankful and to appreciate each day. Shayden was set to graduate from Middleton Grange School at the end of this year.

On Thursday we honoured Niki Hibbert's life. She was a parent in our community from 1999 - 2013. Her children Levi, Alicia, and Seth attended Hillview during this time. Niki became very involved in our school community and had a genuine talent for igniting the hearts of pupils, parents, and staff to support the school in a number of ways. It was not surprising that she ended up leading the Home and School Association for a number of years spearheading a wonderful group of parents who were enthusiastic about blessing the school. Rachel Trengrove has written a lovely tribute to Niki on behalf of the current HSA team and I have included this below.

We continue to pray for their families and friends as they walk this difficult journey together.

It is with a profound sense of privilege that I write this tribute to Niki Hibbert on behalf of the HSA. Aroha Skinner and I inherited the legacy that Niki left to the HSA in 2013. When joining the HSA I was struck with the rich history and culture that had gone before my time. Niki Hibbert was the name on everyone's lips! Niki was instrumental in and passionate about raising money for the gym. It was under her guidance that the HSA and school community managed to raise the whopping total of approximately \$300 000.

I was always impacted by the presence of our Loving Father that Niki carried. She had a great sense of humour, a ready smile and that 'twinkle' in her eyes that was her hallmark. She had such a big network, from Hillview, to CYS to Strengths, and her church, Grace Vineyard. Her funeral was a fitting tribute to the incredible woman of God she was, and the legacy she leaves to us all, especially her precious family.

Chris and Niki totally believed that Niki would be healed. And healed she was, when she ascended into the presence of her Saviour on Easter Sunday. Interesting timing don't you think?! If I'm being honest, I am left with a feeling of sadness and confusion as to why she wasn't healed in this life. But what I know for sure is that our perfect Father is faithful and He sees the big picture. As I've wrestled with these feelings in the past week peace is slowly settling in my heart. I love the analogy that God is the weaver of the tapestry of our lives. We can only see the underside of the weave - the knots and ties and loose threads. It is only when we enter eternal life that we see the rich and beautiful pattern that He has woven.

Our thoughts and prayers are with Chris, Alicia, Levi and Seth as they grieve the loss of a woman who was so much to so many, but most of all a wonderful wife and mother.


