Kia ora Parents.

I would like to share two grandma stories.

Our class has a class grandma. June Hyde is an elderly lady who has been coming into Room 11 for the last four years or so. June visits between morning tea and lunch every Friday and talks to the children and reads with them. She loves spending time with them, and they love spending time with her.

About a month back my husband got a call from June before I arrived home from school. June explained that she had suffered a small stroke, had had to spend a night in hospital, and wouldn't be able to visit our class for the next week or two. I conveyed this news to the

children the following day and they were visibly moved. Spontaneously they suggested that we make cards for her. I

told them we could do this in place of the fun activity we do on Fridays, and they enthusiastically agreed. Later that morning I could have

heard a pin drop as they wrote messages to Mrs Hyde and decorated their cards with serious determination. They wanted to do their very best to cheer her up. When I dropped those cards around to June the following day it was her turn to be visibly moved. She read every word they had written, poured over every illustration, and then put those cards in pride of place in her small unit. This was compassion in action. The children had heard about her need, and then had done something to help alleviate her suffering.

The second story also involves compassion and a grandma. Last week I had tell my class that, sadly, one of the girls in our class had lost her grandma. We talked together about what we would do for her when she came back to school. We discussed how she would probably be feeling and what could be helpful for her. On Tuesday morning a small delegation rushed in to tell me that the bereaved girl was back. A group escorted her into the room, gathered around her desk, and produced various things they had brought for her. There were a number of delightfully written sympathy cards - definitely straight from the hearts of children, and some small gifts. Some children had gone through their personal treasures and chosen some to give away as an expression of their love and concern.

Compassion, as quoted above, is 'looking out for another's interest, not just your own'. What a privilege to see six and seven-year-old children respond in compassion to the needs they see around them. What a privilege to teach in a school where this value can be tied right back to the example of Jesus. What a privilege to be working with parents who are modelling and encouraging this behaviour in their children.

ready, and spending lots of quality time swapping photos with our friends on the latest devices. But all excuses aside, these activities don't make us more 'relevant' to teens: they simply distract us from them. And unlike toddlers, teens have enough dignity to not bother with adults who clearly have better things to do. They're not going to expose the inner struggles of their souls to someone who can't even make eye contact. Teens need adults in their lives who aren't enslaved to the overconsumption of media and the neck-breaking pace of life. They need adults who stop to really listen to them, who are willing to cancel things and take the time to help sort out the spontaneous emotional and relational emergencies that come up in the lives of teens almost every day. Discipling teens requires givealittle constant availability, willing flexibility, and happily undivided attention. Tons of it.
