As a child growing up, I never thought about the culture of Tokoroa, my home town, nor even New Zealand, my home country. It wasn't until I travelled overseas that I realised that New Zealand has a very strong culture, and one that is quite different to Indonesia, America, or even Australia.

Since having this experience, I am more attuned to how people experience a new culture. Asking people who are new to church how they are finding the experience can help us see our church through their eyes. Asking people new to our country about their perceptions of the people and customs can help us learn how best to integrate newcomers. Asking people new to our school to reflect on their experience can tell us a lot about what

stands out in our school culture.

At our last whole school staff meeting, we were given some reflections on Hillview culture by two staff who had joined us at the beginning of Term 3. Megan van Leeuwen and

Julz Smith had both flown into the country from England and Brunei respectively during the last holiday break. They had moved from a different national and school culture into the Hillview culture, with scarcely enough

time to take a breath. As newcomers, they had asked for an opportunity to speak to the staff about what stood out to them about Hillview.

Firstly, they were overwhelmingly grateful for the Biblical core values and beliefs. They mentioned the warm welcome they had been given, the willingness of staff to go the extra mile for them, and the way the school was bathed in prayer. One of the ladies reflected on a difficult meeting she had had in her previous school, where all she wanted to do at the end of it was pray, something that would have been totally anathema. She was so thankful for the constant prayer at Hillview, occurring so naturally in a variety of situations.

Secondly, they mentioned striving for high standards. They saw the school's Christian culture leading to a desire to pursue excellence in all areas. They had been challenged to maintain their high standards, and had also been given support to enable enough them to do SO.

Finally, they reflected on the warm, caring, and nurturing relationships between staff, parents, and children. They found the school community to be genuine - people said what they meant and then followed through. They mentioned the Hillview practice of celebrating staff birthdays where others prepare morning tea goodies for the birthday celebrant, and then give a speech to acknowledge and thank them for their contribution to the school.

Having recent arrivals speak so positively of our school culture should make us very thankful, because......

Tips for Learning

Tips for Discipling Teens

John the Baptist was the ultimate case of someone working himself out of a job. Several of John's disciples (probably teens themselves) left John to follow Jesus, no doubt because they were so inspired by John's own devotion to Jesus (John 1:35-37). If you've discipled teens for long enough you know that this is truly one of the challenges. Unlike the neighbour or the friend at work or the cousin you might be discipling, the teens in your life are moving on. They're a couple years from leaving home, going to college, getting married. If they follow Christ, you're most likely going to lose them... and that's the point.

You want the teens you disciple to become independently reliant on him, willing to go wherever he leads them, no matter how dangerous or remote. You want them to find other godly heralds of Christ to pursue-friends, mentors, even future spouses. It will feel at moments like they've lost interest in you, like you have been discarded for someone more interesting or relevant. But if they are leaving you to follow Christ, you've done your job. Take comfort: you're decreasing as Christ increases.
