

Reading With Y3-6 Children

After the alphabetic principle has been grasped and children are becoming fluent in their reading, the next steps in helping them to read involve encouraging good comprehension as well as accurate decoding. Here are some suggestions as to what you could do:

When reading aloud, encourage your child to accurately sound out names of people or places. This helps a child to remain careful about how they decode unknown words


